

What to do in case of LPG leakage

- When you smell LPG odour, do not panic.
- Don't turn on any electrical appliances or light switches.
- Turn off the LPG regulator.
- Open all windows and doors to properly ventilate
- Be calm and remove the cylinder out of the room.
- Inform the wholesaler or the brand owner.

How to handle and store LPG

- Keep the cylinder in an upright position when transporting and storing.
- Observe separation distance between cylinder and stove/cooker/oven (a minimum separation distance of 30 cm is recommended).
- Keep the cylinder in an airy place.
- Do not rollover, throw or bang the cylinder.
- Do not store cylinders in exits or aisles.
- Avoid exposing cylinders to rain and direct sun.



How to correctly use LPG cylinders

- Ensure the hose, regulator or burner is well fitted.
- When using a rubber hose, ensure there are no visible cracks. Replace hose after three years.
- Strike match before turning on LPG burner or regulator.
- Never leave the burner un-attended during use
- Ensure to turn off the LPG burner or regulator after use.
- Ensure that you get LPG from genuine gas suppliers and source.
